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A grant of Rs. 20,00,000/- was sanctioned to the college under the scheme of "Additional Assistance to the Colleges" already included under 12B during XII plan period and procured equipment i.e., 10 KVA Solar Power, RO Water Plant etc., during 2014.

ACADEMIC COURSES

An important development occurred in July 1951, when the Biology, Physics and Chemistry group was opened and 94 students were admitted. In July 1952, the college was raised to First Grade and B.A. and B.Com. courses were opened. The year 1953 saw further progress. B.Sc. class with Zoology (Main) and Chemistry and Botany (Subsidiaries) was opened. Civics and Indian Administration were offered as optional subjects in Intermediate and in Arts groups, classes were opened in Sanskrit for Intermediate and in Hindi for B.A. In July 1957, the Pre University course was opened with eight combinations of optional subjects. In July 1958, the three year degree courses were started in the College, thus making our institution conform to the national pattern of education.

In accordance with the new pattern of education, the college started a new two year intermediate course from the academic year 1969-70. A new pattern of degree course, called New Scheme with Main and Ancillaries was started with effect from the academic year 1971-72 with Telugu as the medium of instruction.

The starting of M.Com. course in 1974-75 was another notable achievement which made the college one of the handful of affiliated colleges in Andhra Pradesh to have the privilege of offering instruction at the postgraduate level.

The college crossed yet another milestone in 1991-92, when keeping the ever growing importance of Computer Science and Electronics in view and also responding to the popular demand for instruction in these subjects, two new restructured B.Sc. courses, one with Mathematics, Physics and Computer Science and the other with Mathematics, Physics and Electronics combinations were started.

Expansion of academic facilities was the order of the day and in keeping with this trend of the College got permission and started the M.B.A. course in 1993-94. Appropriately enough, the course was inaugurated by Sri Y.C. Simhadri, then Vice-Chancellor of Nagarjuna University on 7-2-1994. A new P.G. course, M.Sc., in Mathematics was commenced in 1994-95.

The new courses in high demand, M.C.A., M.Sc., (Computer Science), BCA and a new stream in B.Sc., course with Mathematics, Statistics and Computer Science were started during the academic year 1998-99.

In keeping pace with the high demand for B.Ed. course a sister college in the name of A.N.R. College of Education was started during the year 1999-2000.

In December 2004, Dr. K. Ramesh (USA) and Sri K. Ranjith Prasad (Vijayawada) donated an amount of 22,750 US dollars (about Rupees 10,00,000/-) in the name of their father late Sri K.G. Prasad Rao, a former Lecturer in Chemistry in this college towards the development of infrastructure for A.N.R. College of Education.

HISTORICAL SKETCH

ORIGINS

The 'Gudivada College', started in 1950, is the result of munificence and zeal for higher education of the people of Gudivada region and of the neighbouring villages in Krishna District. The town is situated in a rich agricultural area midway between Vijayawada and Machilipatnam and connected through road and railway with the leading towns and villages in the district. Gudivada has always been a centre of great cultural and political activity and its citizens have played a prominent role in the life of the nation in general and of Andhra desa in particular. But the lack of a seat of higher learning was actually felt, and to meet this need, a strong committee of local leaders was formed early in 1950 and an appeal for funds was made over the name of the following persons: Sri Parvataneni Venkataratnam (President), Sri Uppalapati Veerabhadra Rao (Treasurer), Sri Kaza Venkataramaiah (Secretary), Sri Vemulapalli Ramabrahmam (Joint Secretary) and Sarvasri Vadde Sobhanadri, Lingam Venkatakrishnaiah and Upadrashta Papanna Sastri as members.

INAUGURATION

The College Organising Committee approached the authorities of the Andhra University in April, 1950 with the request that permission might be given to organize the institution and have it affiliated to the University. The inspection committee appointed by the University visited Gudivada in May 1950 and reported in favour of granting the affiliation. The College was formally inaugurated under the name 'The Gudivada College' by Prof. V.S. Krishna, Vice Chancellor of Andhra University, on July 6, 1950 at a public meeting over which the Honourable Sri Bezawada Gopala Reddy, Finance Minister, Government of Madras, presided. It was temporarily located in a fine building on the main road. The Secretary of the Organising Committee, Sri Kaza Venkataramaiah became the Correspondent of the College.

INFRASTRUCTURE

The year January 1958 witnessed the opening of the college playground at the new site which was the beginning of a new era in the history of the College. It is in the fitness of things to mention here that the philanthropic villagers of Pedaparupudi and Bhushanagulla, which abut the college ground, donated as many as 15 acres of land. Additional land could be purchased through the generous donations of Rs. 60,000/- and Rs 40,000/- by the farmers of these two villagers respectively.

There were a few donations by understanding individuals: three acres of land by Smt. Mandava Rama Tulasamma, 1.12 acres by Sri Kolli Bhadraiah and 0.5 acres by Sri Vellanki Akkaiah Chowdary, which contributed to the extension of the college boundaries.

In February 1959, the next step forward was taken. The foundation stone for the new building was laid by Dr. V.S. Krishna, the then Vice-Chancellor of Andhra University. Construction work began at once and the eastern wing of the ground

floor came into being, a bare necessity for the Office, Principal's room, Laboratories and Library. Simultaneously, a spacious auditorium was also constructed. On account of a donation of about Rs. 60,000/-, it was named after Sri Yerneni Chalamaih.

Since Sri Akkineni Nageswara Rao and his admirers gave a donation of One Lakh rupees, the College was named after him from April 1959. The 10th College Day was celebrated at the new site in February 1960 and the College moved to its permanent location in July 1960. Sri A.F. Thyagaraju, the first Principal of the college left the institution on July 16, 1966 to join the Noble College, Machilipatnam, on its revival. Dr. Y. Venkateswara Rao, Vice Principal was promoted as Principal. As soon as he took over, he could secure the active and willing cooperation of three popular doctors, Dr. A.V. Raghavaiah, Dr. T.L. Perumallu and Dr. P.L. Narasimha Rao for the completion of remaining portion of the building. Their active participation in the construction activity culminated in the collection of fairly handsome donations (about Rs. 1,75,000/-) from the philanthropic public of Gudivada and neighbouring villages. To this was added, as promised, a sum of about Rupees One Lakh by the friends and admirers of Akkineni Nageswara Rao. Together with Government grants, this was utilised for the construction of western wing of the ground floor and the first floor of both eastern and western sides of the main building. Teaching work at last began in the cement concrete rooms, a dream come true for the staff.

A spacious Biology Museum, with over 1000 mounted specimens of plants and animals, fossils and models, is housed in the ground floor of the western wing. A well-kept herbarium and an assortment of wood samples are also present in the museum.

The next phase of construction was another mammoth project, the Library. This was constructed on modern lines, with maximum facilities for each category of the college populace - boy students, girl students and staff. The construction work went on uninterrupted and by 1975 an imposing and spacious gymnasium was also built and it has since been utilized by students and staff with great enthusiasm. Consequent on donation of Rs. 25,000/-, the gymnasium was named after Sri Kolli Lingaiah.

Another huge building, Sri Yerneni Govindaiah Junior College building (Rs One Lakh was provided by Sri Govindaiah's son Sri Ramachandra Rao) was completed by 1984 on the eastern side of College campus and has been in use since 1985. This building added many more number of class rooms to the existing ones.

The foundation stone for the Post-graduate wing was laid in 1985 and the construction of the building was completed in 1992. The Post Graduate department was shifted to the new building during 1992-93. Foundations stone was laid for Post- Graduate block II on 22-8-1994 by the then Chairman of the University Grants Commission, Prof. G. Rami Reddy.

The block was named after Yarlagadda Sobhanadri owing to a donation of Rs. 3 lakhs by his son Dr. Y. Nageswara Rao (USA) of Pedaparupudi.

The construction of men's hostel was completed in 1996 with the assistance of UGC as part of VIII Plan Development Projects. The extension of hostel was begun in 1998 and the first floor was completed in 1999 with assistance of UGC's IX Plan funds.

A spacious laboratory with 75 Pentium-based computers was opened during the academic year 1998-99 to cater to the needs of students of MCA and M.Sc. (Computer Science). In view of the ever-expanding demand for the computer education and to provide more facilities to the students of B.Sc. (Maths, Statistics/ Physics and Computer Sciences), another laboratory was opened with at least 45 latest computers during 1999-2000. It was named after Dr. Yarlagadda Lakshmi Prasad, who generously contributed Rs 15 lakhs from his M.P. (Local Area Development Scheme) funds.

Construction of first floor of western part main building was completed during 2004-2005. Extension work of first floor on eastern part of the main building was completed during 2005-2006. A huge three-storied building by the name of 'Golden Jubilee Commemoration Building' was built during 2000-2001. Funds for this building were also received from the alumnus of the college, Sri Cherukuri Ramoji Rao, News Paper Baron and owner of ETV and Ramoji Film City, who donated Rs. 10 lakhs. Yarlagadda Lakshmi Prasad another alumnus of the college also contributed Rs. 10 lakhs from his M.P. LADS funds for the construction of this building.

A fully furnished Internet facility was established for the benefit of students as well as staff members to equip themselves with the latest knowledge and developments taking throughout the world.

A 400 m running track (width 9.76m) was laid during 2005-2006 at a cost of Rs. three lakhs, which was sanctioned by UGC under X Plan. The Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports granted Rs three lakhs and it was utilised by the College to equip the gymnasium with Multi-Gym with 12 stations, Joggers (manual and electronic), Exercise cycles, Electronic Treadmill, Twisters, Vibrators and Weight Lifting set.

An extension to the eastern wing with two floors was also completed in 2006 and it houses a Seminar Hall, laboratories and class rooms.

A hostel for women in the name of "Akkineni Annapurna Women's Hostel" was also constructed during 2003-04. Extension of women's hostel is taken up in the year 2008 and it has been in use presently. New dining hall and kitchen were attached to the women's hostel with state of the art facilities from the academic year 2010-2011.

A Grant of Rs.10,00,000/- was sanctioned to the College towards One Time Financial Assistance to NAAC Accredited Colleges under assistance of University Grants Commission for "Strengthening of infrastructure in terms of Power Supply" and this was used to procure a 180KVA Cummins Generator during 2010.

A Grant of Rs. 25,00,000/- was sanctioned to the College under the scheme of "Additional Assistance to the Colleges already included under 12B" during XI Plan Period and procured the Equipment during 2011.

In view of the growing demand for basic sciences, the college got permission to start an additional section of B.Sc., with Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry in the year 2003-2004.

A Research Centre, under the purview of Acharya Nagarjuna University, was established in the College for the benefit of pursuers of research and highest learning.

He served the college in many capacities. Treasurer, Secretary & Correspondent and President. The college places on record his yeoman service.

Sri Kancharla Lakshmana Swamy, who served as Secretary & Correspondent of the College during 1993-98 passed away on 30-05-2012.

Sri Akkineni Nageswara Rao (89), Chairman of the College, passed away on 21-1-2014. In the Condolence Meeting held in the college on 23-1-2014, speakers extolled his qualities. Sri Parvataneni Nageswara Rao, Secretary of the College Committee and Dr. Yerneni Venkateswara Rao, former Principal, said that the college is standing today as it is, thanks to the munificence of this philanthropist. Akkineni is an icon not confined to a time and place. He is a role model to all of us and the stakeholders of the College paid rich tributes to Sri Akkineni Nageswara Rao.

9. Students are advised in their own interest to be punctual and regular in attending the college. They are instructed to ascertain from the attendance clerk at the end of every month whether they are short of attendance.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

A. PERSONAL TUTORIAL SYSTEM

1. Each student is assigned to the care of one of the members of the staff who may be consulted in matter where advice is required.
2. Students should meet the Tutor to whom they are assigned at least once a fortnight on the college premises at a time fixed by the later.
3. The Tutor will acquaint himself with the progress of his wards and submit his report to the Principal at least once a term.
4. Each Tutor will be supplied with a note-book may be called for the Principal at any time for reference and should be sent to the office at the end of the year.
5. All leave letters should be countersigned by the Tutor.
6. The Personal Tutorial system is intended to foster close contact between students and teachers. Students should learn to look upon their Tutors as friends, invite them to their homes or lodges and seek their advice not only in their studies but in all matters pertaining to their daily life and conduct.

B. TUTORIAL CLASSES

1. Attendance for tutorial classes according to the timetable is compulsory.
2. The tutorial classes are intended to provide an opportunity to the teachers to give individual attention to the students and help them in their studies.
3. Students should make the fullest use of the opportunities provided by the Tutorial System to equip themselves for their tasks at college and their duties in life later.

GENERAL RULES

By accepting membership of the college, students accept an obligation to obey its rules and to respect and support its discipline, in the interpretation of the rules and in any academic or disciplinary matter not covered by the rules, they are expected to accept the guidance of the Principal.

RULES & REGULATIONS OF COLLEGE

1. Fees Shall be paid in one or two installments in each term except the first. If paid in one installment, it must be paid not later than the tenth day of the first term. If paid in installments, the first shall be paid not later than the tenth day of the date of commencement of the term.
2. If the last date prescribed for payment of fees happens to be a holiday, fees may be paid on the next working day.
3. Students who pay their fee after the tenth day but before the thirteenth day of each term shall be charged a fine of Rs. 5/-. Thereafter, they are liable to suspension or dismissal if the fees still remain unpaid.
4. A student whose name has been struck off from the rolls may be readmitted after all dues have been paid and on payment of re-admission fee of Rs.5/-.
5. The timings prescribed for the receipt of fees will be indicated on the notice board.
6. Students should obtain and preserve all the receipts for all payments made by them.
7. Fees once paid will not be refunded or adjusted towards some other dues or kept in reserve for some other purpose.

RULES OF ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL

1. Candidates for admission into Junior Intermediate must have passed the X class examination of Andhra Pradesh or some other examination accepted by the Board

of Intermediate Education as equivalent there to. Those seeking admission into the First Degree class should have passed the Intermediate examination of the Intermediate Board or any examination recognized as equivalent there to or have been declared eligible by the Krishna University for admission to university courses. All candidates for admission must present transfer certificates in original from the school or college which they last attended, and must further satisfy the Principal that their conduct and progress were satisfactory at the institution last attended.

2. A Candidate who is found to have obtained admission by false representation of any kind will be summarily dismissed with forfeiture of whatever fees that may have been paid.
3. No candidate for admission will be enrolled or allowed to attend any class until the fees for the first term have been paid. Fees paid once cannot be refunded.
4. A student admitted at any time during a term must pay the entire fee for the term.
5. A student who has duly paid the fees and has been admitted but wishes to leave the college, will be granted a Transfer Certificate, provided he/she applies for it not later than the fifth working day after the admission. If the application is made later, the Transfer Certificate will be issued only on payment of an additional fee of Rs. 10/-.
6. Additional fee will be charged for the issue of duplicate Transfer Certificate. The fee for Date of Birth Certificate or any other certificate of extract is Rs. 5/- for the current students. The fee for other certificates will be announced from time to time
7. Any student who leaves the college without the permission of the Principal before completing the course shall not receive the certificate of conduct.
8. A Student who leaves in the middle of an academic year even with the permission of the Principal, can't claim remission of any portion of the fees already paid.

RULES OF ATTENDANCE

1. Students are required to attend punctually all lecture and practical classes as per the timetable.
2. Attendance will be taken in every class. Students entering the class during the roll-call will be marked present, but those coming late will be marked absent.
3. Absence for any class will be counted as absent for the whole session. There are two sessions in a day: Morning session from 10-00 a.m. onwards and Evening session after lunch-break.
4. Students desiring leaves of absence should apply to the Principal in writing. Application for more than two days leave should bear the counter signature of the parent or guardian. Sick leave will be granted only on the production of medical certificate

6. Absence without leave will entail a fine of Rs.1/- per session.

THE FOLLOWING ARE THE RULES OF LIBRARY

The Library is open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on all working days. The issue counter will be closed at 5 p.m.

The working hours during of vacations will be notified from time to time.

Members of the teaching staff, students, clerks and attenders, members of the College committee and the Librarian are ipso facto members of the library.

Others who wish to become members may be admitted on application to the Principal, recommended by a teacher who shall stand surety. They will be required to make a deposit of Rs. 150/- and to pay a Library Fee of Rs. 150/- per year on

4. Observe discipline and extend courtesy to others. Discipline and courtesy cost you nothing, but their returns will be tremendous.

5. Do not loiter on the campus. If you have leisure, spend the time usefully in the library and reading room.

6. Maintain absolute silence in the library and reading room. You should not disturb fellow-students who are in deep study.

11. Any kind of malpractice at the examination is liable for punishment with fine and expulsion.

12. As the College is a coeducational institution, utmost decency is expected in the behaviour of both boys and girls. Boys in particular, will do well to bear in mind constantly that they should behave towards girl students in the same civilized manner as they expect for their own kind of the fair sex who are or will be students of this or other coeducational institution.

13. The College provides many amenities for you - the Auditorium, the Gymnasium, Audiovisual education, the play fields, a bank, a students Co-operative Stores and a Canteen.

LABORATORIES

1. Science students should attend their practical class regularly since experiments will not be repeated for the sake of absentees.
2. Students should note down all relevant points in observation books and submit their record books punctually. Since the records carry marks, they should be maintained neatly and accurately.
3. Students should not leave the laboratory without returning the apparatus lent to them.
4. Students should handle the apparatus carefully as they have to pay full cost of apparatus they break or spoil even inadvertently. Consumable materials like chemicals should be used sparingly as they are costly.
5. Students of Botany and Zoology are required to participate in excursion organized by the college for studying and collecting new flora and fauna.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The College has a Women Development Centre (WDC). It aims to empower girl students, to enhance understanding of issues related to women and to make the college campus a safe place for women students. INTERNET CENTRE

The College provides internet facility, free of cost, to the students and the staff in the Internet Centre from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. on all working days. On Sundays and other general holidays it works during the morning session only.

MANA TV

The College has made provision for Mana TV. The programmes of Mana TV help students supplement classroom teaching. It provides access for students to interact with subject experts & conducts Special Live Programmes and Teleconferences with experts.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC), NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS) & RED RIBBON CLUB (RRC)

A Senior Division of the National Cadet Corps and a unit of National Service Scheme function in the college. The units are directed by a committee consisting of the Principal and the respective officers.

N.C.C./N.S.S. training is voluntary for all able-bodied students of the college.

1. The training shall extend over a period of two years commencing with the Junior Intermediate class.
2. The trainees shall put in not less than 75 percent of attendance at N.C.C. or N.S.S. programme during each year and attend one compulsory Annual Camp during vacation as per the Rules.
3. Red ribbon club is a movement by the Government of India in educational Institutions through which students will be making awareness of AIDS. Through RRC youth are encouraged to learn about safe and healthy lifestyles.

CENTRAL LIBRARY

The College Library, opened in July 1950 has now a total of 64,197 volumes. It contains books dealing with various subjects of study at the college level and also books of general interest. admission towards membership of the library. If they wish to join the reading room only they need not pay the deposit.

No non-member shall be admitted into the library except when he is introduced by a member, but such admission does not confer the privilege of making use of the library for reference purposes. Students are not permitted to introduce non-members to the library.

Current periodicals may be read only in the place set apart for the purpose.

STRICT SILENCE TO BE OBSERVED IN AND AROUND THE LIBRARY

No member shall be allowed to take his/her books or their belongings into the library.

All books must be applied for and returned in person. No books will be issued to messengers.

Absence from the college will not relieve a borrower of the responsibility of returning the books on the due date.

Members entering or leaving the library should pass all books including note books through the entrance/exit counter.

Students are forbidden from taking books into a place where there is sickness of an infectious nature.

Member shall be allowed books as follows :

Members of the Teaching Staff and Committee	15 to 30 Vols.
Members of the college Clerical Staff	10 to 15 Vols.
Students	2 to 5 Vols.
Attenders	5 Vol.
Others Members granted permission	3 Vols.

Borrowers are eligible to keep a book for 14 days from the date of issue. At the end of the period the books shall be returned to the library, but may be reissued to the same person if it is not in the meantime applied for by some one else. When the book is thus reissued to a person, he/she may retain it for a further period of one week. Ordinarily two renewals may be allowed without the presentation of the book at the counter.

The Librarian may recall a book at any time during the period of its loan.

Any book on loan may be reserved to borrower on application. Such reservations will be notified and dealt with in strict chronological order.

If an applicant fails to ask for a book thus reserved on the date specified, the reservation will lapse automatically.

Back numbers of the periodicals may be issued to members as follows:

Teaching Staff and Committee Members	3 numbers
Clerical Staff	2 numbers
Attenders	1 number
Special Member	2 numbers

They must be returned within 7 days from issue.

Reference books should not be taken out of the library. They may however, be issued to members of the teaching staff for class use; and books thus taken out should be returned before 4-00 pm on the same day. The issued book will be noted in a special register maintained for this purpose.

Borrowers failing to return books or periodicals on or before the day last noted in the date label of the book or periodical should pay a penalty of Rs. 1/- per book or periodical for each day. In the calculation of fines, the day on which the library is not working will not be counted.

When a book is received from the library, it should be examined carefully and the attention of the librarian should be drawn to the defects therein. Otherwise the last borrower will be held responsible for the defects. Every reader borrowing a book shall be responsible for the defects. Every reader borrowing a book shall be responsible for its custody until it is returned. In the event of any loss or damage to the books, he / she shall replace the book at his / her own cost or pay such compensation as may be fixed by the Principal in consultation with the Librarian.

If a volume belonging to a set is lost, the reader may be required to replace the whole set.

Borrowers are not permitted to lend books borrowed from the library to others.

Books, periodicals, Maps etc, should not be marked, written upon or damaged. No tracing is allowed without the permission of the librarian. Cutting or mutilating of books, periodicals or other property of the library is strictly forbidden and will entail penalties which may include suspension of the privilege of membership.

TEXT BOOK LIBRARY

A Text Book Library has been instituted in the college with financial assistance of U.G.C. The purpose of the library is to lend standard text books to students who cannot afford to purchase them. The following are the rules of the text book library.

1. A student who wants to borrow a book should pay 10% of the cost of the book towards maintenance of book. He can retain the book till the last working day of the academic year.
2. No underlining, making comment, etc., should be made anywhere in the book, nor any part of the book torn off. A fine of Rs. 5/- or more will be collected for such markings, underlining etc.
3. The librarian reserves the right to call for its return at any time.
4. If the book is lost or damaged, its present market cost will be recovered in full from the student with a fine of Rs. 5/- towards servicing charges.

Books from the Text Book Library will be issued to the Students as per the following rules.

1. Books will be issued to students belonging to S.C., S.T. and other Economically Backward Classes.
2. If after such issue, books are still available, they will be issued to students belonging to other castes/classes.

3. These books should be returned on or before the last working day.

POST GRADUATE DEPARTMENT OF LIBRARY SCIENCE

The college has a specialized PG library established on 25-09-1975. The PG library is located in the Golden Jubilee Building, with a floor area of nearly 3,600 square feet. The PG library has a good collection of books, periodicals and journals. It is a well stocked library with an Open Access System (fully computerised), neatly segregated subject-wise and field-wise. The library has a collection of over 28,000 volumes and has been subscribing to number of National and International periodicals and journals. Leading English and Telugu dailies are made available to students. The library also possesses encyclopedias and books of general interest.

Electronic Information services are provided in the library to conform to the norms of being an Information Centre.

The library is modernised with the establishment of an online information zone and electronic services are provided. The library is equipped with five computers and it provides the facilities of CD writing, scanning and printing. Photostat facility is also made available to the students and staff.

- The library is open from 8.00 a.m. to 7.30 p.m. on all working days.
- During holidays it will be open from 8.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m.
- E-book facility.
- Computer based Scanning and Xerox facility.
- Journals and Data Base through DELNET.
- Information display and Notification Services.

CORE COURSES: These are discipline specific. Thus the First Degree work load is as follows:

Academic Requirements :

A candidate shall be declared to have passed whole examination of a semester of he/she secures a minimum 40% out of 25 of internal marks (i.e., 10 marks) and 40% out of 75 of end semester examination (i.e., 30 marks) in each theory /practicals.

STAFF ORGANISATIONS

College Council : The College Council consists of the Heads of Department and the Secretary of the Staff Association (ex-officio). It meets whenever there is business to be transacted.

Staff Association : The Staff Association consists of all the members of the teaching staff and Lecturers in Library Science and Physical Education.

Non-Teaching Staff Association : The association consists of all the members of the nonteaching staff of the college.

The Principal is the ex-officio Chairman of both these organisations.

STUDENTS' CO-OPERATIVE STORES

The stores, registered under the rules of Andhra Pradesh cooperative Societies Act, has been formed with a view to encourage the spirit of cooperation and thrift among the students and facilitate the purchase of textbooks, stationery and other essential articles by them.

Akkineni Kalapeetam has its main objectives of creating an aesthetic environment on the campus, as it would be conducive to an integrated growth of the personalities of students. It has some objectives like training students in Public Speaking, Music, Dance, Dramatics, Painting and Creative writing

General Rules and Regulations for Intermediate Course

- 1) College offers Intermediate course in Telugu Medium with Commerce, Economics and Civics as optional subjects.
- 2) Academic year commences in the first week of June and ends on the 31st March of every succeeding year.
- 3) Admissions will be made strictly on the basis of merit i.e., aggregate marks secured in SSC or equivalent examination and the rules of reservation as per the Government orders issued from time to time.
- 4) Candidates who pass SSC examination compartmentally are also eligible for admission into first year Intermediate course. But their cases will be considered only after all the students who passed in one attempt are exhausted.
- 5) For a pass in Intermediate Public Examinations, a candidate must secure 35% of marks in each paper of I & II year examinations separately. However, if a candidate fails in a paper or papers in first or second year Public examinations, he can appear again in the subsequent examinations in those failed papers. A candidate is declared to have passed Intermediate Public Examinations only after passing in all the papers of I & II years.
- 6) Board of Intermediate Education, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad has introduced the "Environmental Education" as a compulsory qualifying subject for the Intermediate first year students from the academic year 2006-07 onwards. Accordingly, if a candidate is not qualified in "Environmental Education", he/she will be considered as failed.
- 7) Board of Intermediate Education has also introduced "Ethics and Human Values" as a compulsory qualifying subject without allotting marks for the first year Intermediate students from the academic year 2014-15. So, it is a mandatory for the Intermediate first year students to qualify in "Ethics and Human Values" examination to obtain the pass certificate of Intermediate course.
- 8) All the candidates who are admitted to appear Intermediate Public Examinations shall have to complete the course within a period of 5 years from the year of first appearance.

- 9) All the failed candidates who could not clear their backlog papers within five years will forgo their previous performance and have to appear as fresh candidates for all the subjects.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

As part of the Reforms in education sector the UGC has recommended to the state governments to introduce Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from the academic year 2015-16. Consequently the semester pattern has been introduced at the UG level from the present academic year 2015-16. It aims to update Curriculum and provide choice to students to keep pace with contemporary trends and to be compatible with Industry requirements. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective or minor or soft skill courses).

CORE COURSE: COMPULSORY courses, knowledge of which is deemed essential for students.

ELECTIVE COURSES: A student shall choose the elective course depending upon his interest and choice. These courses are restricted to semesters V/VI of third year only.

FOUNDATION / SKILL BASED COURSES: Courses, in this category, are aimed at enhancing the professional competency of students and increasing their employment prospects. This category includes courses in (i) Communication Skills (ii) Spoken English (iii) Personality Development, (iv) Environmental, Ethics, etc.

An academic year is divided into two semesters. Semesters are classified as ODD Semesters and EVEN semesters. ODD Semesters: June/July to October/November. EVEN Semesters : November/December to March/April.

Necessary modifications have been made to the existing syllabus or new syllabus has been introduced on need basis. The CBCS will be applicable to the First Year Degree students from the academic year 2015-16. There will be an external examination for 75 marks at the end of a semester and the internal component will be for 25 marks. In the internal assessment 5 marks are allotted for Seminar, 5 marks for assignment and 5 marks for regular attendance. There will be two mid-semester examinations and the average marks from these two will be reduced to 10 thus making the total marks in internal evaluation to 25. It is also agreed upon to have only two question types one long answer question for 10 marks and one paragraph question for 5 marks in all the subjects. The necessary syllabus and the model question papers have been provided to all the departments and they can also be accessed on the website of Krishna University <http://www.krishnauniversity.ac.in/Examportal/Default.aspx>.

General Rules and Regulations for U.G. Course

Admission :

Candidates who have passed the Intermediate Examination from the Board of Intermediate Education, A.P. or any other examination recognized as equivalent there to are eligible.

Further, candidates who would appear for the Intermediate Advanced Supplementary examination should also apply for admission before the last date. They will be considered for admission only after they pass and submit the memorandum of marks of the Intermediate Examination before the last date of admission, subject to availability of vacancies.

Admission Rules :

1. a) Candidates seeking admission to I year B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Gen/Computers/Comp.Appln.)/B.Com.(Voc)/BBM/BCA/BAOL Degree courses must have passed Two year Intermediate Examination conducted by the Board of Intermediate Education, Andhra Pradesh OR an Examination of any other University/Board recognized as equivalent.

b) In respect of the candidates, who have passed Intermediate (Vocational) courses from Board of Intermediate Education, A.P., and +2 examination conducted BY Boards other than Board of Intermediate Education of A.P., ICSE and CBSE, the Principals of respective colleges should ensure that the candidates shall submit Eligibility Certificate issued by Board of Intermediate A.P., Further the admissions made without obtaining Eligibility Certificate will not be considered by the University and such admissions shall deemed to be cancelled automatically and the College Management will be held responsible for such violation.

c) The candidates who have passed Intermediate (Vocational) Medical Lab Technology Course from Board of Intermediate Education, A.P., are eligible for admission into B.A./B.Com, courses only. However, those who are holding 'Bridge course' along with Intermediate (Vocational) Medical Lab Technology are eligible for B.Sc. courses.

2. a) Admissions to I st year of the 3-years Degree courses will be made in order of merit as shown by aggregate marks secured by the candidates at the qualifying examination in one attempt.

b) Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination in parts shall be considered for admission, only after all the candidates under category (a) above are accommodated.

3. a) Candidates seeking admission to B.Sc. Ist year course should have passed and secured an aggregate of 40% marks (a Pass Percentage in case of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes) in the concerned Science Subjects (i.e. Physical Sciences and Mathematics OR Physical Sciences, and Biological Sciences as the case may be) at the qualifying examination. Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Arts/Commerce subjects are not eligible for admission to B.Sc. course.

b) Candidates who have passed Intermediate examination with Mathematics, Economics and Commerce combination can be considered eligible for admission to (Maths, Statistics and Computer Science) combination of B.Sc. only.

c) Candidates who have passed qualifying examination with Science / arts / Commerce subjects are eligible for admission to B.A./B.Com. (Gen/Computers)/ BCA/BBM courses.

Change of optional Subjects:

Candidates can be permitted to change the optional subjects (where practicals are not involved) on or before stipulated time mentioned in the academic calendar. No change shall be permitted after this date.

Attendance

Every candidate is required to put in a minimum 75% attendance in order to appear for the University Examinations. Shortage of attendance to the extent of 10% will be condoned by the University on Medical grounds and on payment of the prescribed fee for Year-wise Course and Semester Course. If any candidate does not put in the required attendance he/she shall not be permitted to appear for the Examination. However, in respect of Women candidates who seek condonation of attendance due to pregnancy, the Vice-chancellor may condone the deficiency in attendance to the extent of 15% (as against 10% condonation for others) on medical grounds subject to submission of medical certificate to this effect. Such condonation shall not be availed twice during the course of study.

The Principals have to forward the requests for grant of condonation of shortage in attendance to the University well in advance i.e. within one week from the last date of instruction. No requests for the grant of condonation of shortage in attendance will be accepted after commencement of examinations. Further, in case it is found that any college allows the candidates directly to appear for the examination against the rules, the results of such candidates shall not be declared by the University and the colleges will be held responsible for the lapse.

Admission to another Degree Course

Candidates who have completed a particular Degree course in a Faculty from the University, shall not be allowed to seek regular admission, in view of the fact that the students seeking fresh admission, for the first time will be deprived of the opportunity and that there is a provision for appearing at the Under Graduate Degree Examination through Distance Education.

Time Limit to Complete the Course:

Candidates who have joined Degree Course are required to complete the course within double the duration of the period i.e. six years from the date of admission.
